## **BLM Protest on the Common Draws Hundreds**

CRAFTSBURY COMMON Hundreds gathered on the Common last Wednesday, June 10, to protest the killing of George Floyd by a Minneapolis police officer. The protest began with the entire crowd walking around the Common twice, followed by eight minutes and forty-six seconds of silence to mark the time Floyd was pinned by the policeman before he died. Some protesters kneeled, some bowed their heads. others staged a "die-in," lying on the turf face-down. An unplanned, unscripted round of impromptu speeches from those in the crowd took place from the gazebo, with people lining up to give testimony of their thoughts on racism and police brutality.
